Official Report of the DS Report Committee

OPENING STATEMENT

As members of the DS Report Committee, we are honored to have been given the privilege to review and analyze the DS Report for the 47th Annual Conference of the Hmong District of the C&MA. The DS Report Committee gives thanks to God through Jesus Christ for empowering the DS and Hmong District staff to advance the Gospel worldwide by faithfully supporting Hmong District local churches, equipping them to raise the next generation of witnesses, and encouraging other Christians and ministry partners in the Alliance family and around the world.

OBJECTIVE OF THE DS REPORT COMMITTEE

The purpose of the DS Report Committee is to review and observe the big picture of the organization in terms of vision, goals, and objectives, and to analyze the system on how the administration operates, manages, controls, and strategizes.¹

Commendations and Suggestions

1) Commendations

- a) We commend the efforts of Hmong Christian Institute (HCI) for their diligence in training current and future leaders of our Hmong District local churches. Specifically, we highlight the 81 new TEE students, 112 TEE graduates, 8 new MSP students, and 4 MSP graduates that reveals growing leadership for the Hmong District domestically (p. 16).
- b) We commend the efforts of NextGen Ministries and thank the Lord for their diligent work and monthly travels to support and offer guidance to Hmong District local churches to raise future leaders. As a result of God's provision and their work, HLUB 2025 had an attendance of 3,600 youth and 185 of those youth gave their lives to Christ by publicly declaring their faith through baptism. We trust that many more youth will come to know and commit their lives to Christ, becoming the pillars of our Hmong District local churches for the next 75 years (p. 20-25).
- c) We commend the Alliance Men for their efforts to persevere in ministry. Despite the difficulties of having men participate in recent years, it is noted that there is a new generation of younger men becoming leaders, stepping forward to take on leadership roles and responsibilities and being mentored and encouraged by older men (p. 63).

- d) We commend Overseas Tribal Services (OTS) for its clear vision, and unwavering commitment to serving vulnerable tribal communities. Even during periods of leadership transition in 2025, the ministry remained focused and intact, achieving its goals through faithful stewardship and compassionate service. OTS has also demonstrated significant impact through life-changing initiatives, including water well development projects, hostel support, educational programs, emergency assistance, and disaster relief efforts. As a result, immediate needs and long-term community developments were achieved, reflecting Christ's love (p. 79-83).

2) Suggestions

- a) We find that the DS Report consisted of church closures within the last year without informative explanations or general, overall reasons (p. 12). As an official report for the annual conference, we believe it to be beneficial to lean towards transparency by providing a brief, categorical description to explain a church's closure to help readers assess the health of the Hmong District.
- b) Looking back from 2020, the total amount collected for the Great Commission Fund (GCF) increased from \$783,901 to \$1,008,793 in 2024. However, the fund decreased to \$958,210 in 2025 (p. 28). We believe that future DS reports would benefit from having more research to explain any sudden decreases to help Hmong District local churches understand any new challenges and give more towards the GCF.
- c) After reviewing the DS report, an auditor's statement or report was not included. We believe that an auditor's statement or report would help with financial transparency, creating confidence in Hmong District members at large that the financial amounts displayed or explained are true and accurate.
- d) At the end of the report, we find that the appendices would improve with the following:
 - i. Include a brief summary or highlights section that presents key financial trends, major ministry expenditures, and significant outcomes to help readers understand how financial stewardship directly contributes to the ministry's mission and impact.
 - ii. Average attendance numbers when compared with inclusive members in local churches might be greatly skewed and unclear to readers causing confusion. It would benefit to distinguish online attendance and in-person attendance in future DS reports for clarity.

FINAL WORDS

In conclusion, the DS Report Committee commends the DS and the Hmong District staff for their leadership and abounding work for the Lord. It is without a doubt that God has prepared in advance, good works for them to accomplish this past year and the blessed result is the further advancement of the kingdom of God. We look forward to seeing how God will continue to bless the Hmong District for His glory and work in the hearts of the Hmong people to take all of Jesus to all the world for the next 75 years.
